ACTIVE OUTDOOR ADVENTURES & DESTINATIONS

Unique experiences will have you pondering nature in a whole new way.

Jay C. Hormel Nature Center:

With groomed cross country skiing and snowshoeing trails, an engaging interpretive center, and winter woodland and prairie scenes, the Jay C. Hormel Nature Center in Austin will be an enriching destination for the whole family this winter.

City of Winona Ice Park:

Converted from a bluff, this ice climbing park in Winona is one of the few in the nation. Start at the bottom of the bluff with snowshoes, then work your way up. The unique nature of ice climbing, with constantly changing shape, form and texture of the ice, makes for a newly challenging experience each visit.

Ney Nature Center:

Located just outside the town of Henderson, the whole family will enjoy participating in the Christmas bird count, orienteering, or geocaching. Rent cross-country skis and snowshoes and stretch out on the groomed winter trails. While exploring the Pond Trail and the Prairie Loop, you can search for animal tracks, including deer, turkey, mink, and coyote. Stop by the 1850s farmstead site including the Ney Family log cabin.

Horse Barn & Hunt Club:

Enjoy the best of two worlds at this local favorite in Lakefield, where you can relax next to the cozy stone fireplace after a day of play on the sporting clays range or while out pheasant hunting. Finish the day with delicious steak, seafood and drinks.

Winter Celebrations


The world is your snowball! Get festive with choreographed light shows, local merchants, and horsedrawn carriage rides.

Sparks of joy and wonder abound at the Kiwanis Holiday Lights Festival, with lighted tunnels, live reindeer and more fun at Mankato's Sibley Park.

Sleepy Eye Holiday Lights in Motion at Sportman's Park will bring out your holiday spirit with 85 decorated trees choreographed to music and horse & carriage rides.

The day after Thanksgiving, get your celebration started at the Red Wing Holiday Stroll, where you can meet Santa & Mrs. Claus, see baby reindeer, watch fireworks, get a head start on shopping, and marvel at the lighted parade.

At the Blue Earth Holiday Sampler, local businesses light up the town with festive luminaries, and a small merchant sampler takes place at the Senior Center. Shop 'til you drop, then jump on a horse-drawn trolley and get your picture taken with Santa & Mrs. Claus.









SNOW SPORTS

Ski, snowshoe, bike, board, hike, slide, ice-climb, hot chocolate, repeat. Layer up and get out there--winter is calling you.

Downhill

Mount Kato in Mankato offers downhill skiing, snowboarding, and snow tubing. Plan a tubing party and get some air in the terrain park.

Welch Village has 45 inches of average annual snowfall, Explore this 140-acre park, a community favorite since 1965 with 60 trails and a summit reaching 1060 feet.


Cross Country Skiing

With year-round camper cabins, diverse wildlife, migrating waterfowl, and courses ranging from beginner to advanced, make SOMN your next XC ski destination.

Flandrau State Park has 6 miles of groomed cross country ski trails, a warming house, and views of the Big Cottonwood River. Ski on flat trails in the valley or challenging routes through oak bluffs. Stop at the historic stone buildings and learn about the history of the area.

For candlelight skiing events, visit the Minnesota DNR website and search "candlelight" to get the latest information about events at many state parks and trails throughout the winter.

Eagle's Nest County Park along the south fork of the Watonwan river near St. James boasts 80 acres of wooded and scenic recreation areas, including over a mile of trails.





Kaplan's Woods Park in Owatonna has 7 miles of trails ranging from easy to intermediate. Discover Lake Kholmire and the Straight River while you're out exploring.

Snowshoeing

Take part in this traditional Minnesotan activity this season! Rent or buy equipment from a SOMN vendor.

Snowshoe anywhere in Camden State Park and watch for whitetail deer. Snowshoe rental available.

Minneopa State Park, established in 1905, offers snowshoe rental and camper cabins with year-round use. Find the frozen Minneopa Creek waterfalls, which is Dakota for "water falling twice."

In Sakatah Lake State Park, snowshoe through maple and basswood forests, and on Big Woods Trail. Sakatah means "the singing hills."

Frontenac State Park has 4.7 miles of un-groomed snowshoe trails, or you can blaze your own trail. Enjoy the warming house, sliding hill, and Lake Pepin. Look for bald eagles and see the natural limestone arch on the blufftop called In-Yan-Teopa, Dakota for "rock with opening."

Snowmobiling

Sleddin', snowmachinin' or ski-dooin', whatever you call it, SOMN has a slammin' snowmobiling scene and is unmatched in trail and terrain opportunities.

Lake Shetek State Park offers 5 miles of groomed trails, connecting to the Murray County trail system. Trails wind through woodlands and prairies, and the park contains a unique stone warming house and four heated camper cabins available year round.

In Big Stone County, check out Ron's Snowmobile Museum in Hector, Tours by appointment only. Call 320-979-5713 to schedule your visit.

Ride the world-class. 47-mile Goodhue Pioneer State Trail, connecting Red Wing to Zumbrota through charming small towns, forest, river valley, and prairie.

Sakatah Singing Hills State Trail runs from Faribault to Mankato, and within Sakatah Lake State Park you'll enjoy groomed trails and appreciate the beautiful lake, a natural widening of the Cannon River.







SPORTSMAN ICE FISHING CONTEST, LAKE CITY

Ice Fishing

More and more ice anglers regard SOMN as a top destination for winter fishing. Tackle up, grab a buddy, and see for yourself at one of our dozens of winter fishing locations.

- → Fountain Lake in Albert Lea is a shallow, 521-acre body of water with northern pike, walleye, crappie, yellow perch, catfish and largemouth bass. This lake is located at the headwaters of the Shell Rock River and has several bays.
- → Impressive Lake Shetek, 3,596 acres in size, with 5 public access entries, boasts walleye, crappie, pike and perch. Try ice fishing on a weekday to take advantage of lighter fishing pressure.
- → At Washington Lake, located 10 miles northeast of Mankato, explore 1,519 acres of winter water with 2 public access entries. Walleye, bluegill, crappie and other species have been found in the lake. Try using a jig tipped with a wax worm.
- → For winter river fishing, give the Mississippi River backwaters a try. From Red Wing to Winona, there are public access points within each city. Fish for sunfish, crappie, perch, and pike. Try moving around and exploring with a tear-drop jig with a wax worm or minnow.





Winter Fat Tire Biking

Polar off-road cycling experience abound in SOMN's parks and trails, and there are plenty of cozy places to thaw out and curl up by a fire after your day on the trails.

Set off from the town of Marshall and ride the Camden Regional Trail to Camden State Park. Once in the park, you will enjoy 4.25 miles of mountain biking trails with views of the Redwood River and Brawner Lake.

Begin at Lakeside Park in Ortonville, where you will find your way to the Minnesota River State Trail, 12.3 miles of asphalt and dirt surfaces.

Pedal on at the Riverbend Nature Center in Faribault, with 10 miles of biking trails and a year-round interpretive center great for warming up and learning about the area's natural features and history.

In Winona, the Bronk Unit Plowline Trail within the Richard J. Dorer Memorial Hardwood State Forest offers 6.5 miles of groomed fat biking trails with beautiful views and a scenic overlook of a 500-foot rise in the landscape.

Listen, learn, experience, explore. For curious travelers, SOMN offers countless enrichment opportunities in the arts, culture and history.

The Pipestone Performing Arts Center, located in the historic district of Pipestone. is housed within a Sioux Quartzite Building dating back to 1897. Catch resident groups like the Al Opland Singers and the Calumet Players, or check the events page on their website.

Take the whole family to the Children's Museum of Southern Minnesota in Mankato where you can play in the AgLab, Alltech Farm, indoor climbing areas, quarry, and Imagineering Loft.

Waseca Arts Center's rotating gallery of art, as well as its permanent collection, is a perfect place to reflect and ponder artistic expression. The center offers classes for all ages and a gift shop. Admission is free.

Learn about the history of Lake City, the birthplace of water skiing! Lake City's historic City Hall, Museum, & Ballroom feature 1899 construction and are listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Explore the museum, located on the second floor of city hall, and discover historic photos and artifacts.



Arli-Dazzle Parade in Arlington: Dress up in your festive best and get some fun shots at one of the largest lighted holiday parades in the state!


















DESTINATION DATE NIGHT


Babymoon:

Try your hand at disc golf this spring at Cedar Creek Disc Golf in Fairmont, with three 18-hole courses. Since 1996. Cedar Creek has offered fun for disc golfers, from beginners to experts and everyone in between.


Work up a sweat on the Schindler's Way mountain bike trail in Austin, named for the athlete who developed the trail.

At **Ramsey Park** in Redwood Falls, walk the beautiful trails and check out the interesting water features within the park. Pack a picnic and stay the day!

Hike 4.5 miles at Minneopa State Park while listening to the sounds of the falls. Your path will take you on a limestone stairway and will lead you to breathtaking views of the valley.

Loon Lake Golf Course is a 9-hole. public course where kids 10 and under with an adult golf for free. Enjoy the full bar and kitchen!

Hike the paved Circle Trail at the Pipestone National Monument in about an hour. See pipestone quarries, Winnewissa Falls, native grasses, and historical markers including Old Stone Face and the Oracle.




Explore It!



Pick your own berries, hunt for legendary mushrooms, and enjoy the best of the season at local markets, all while learning about SOMN's bustling agricultural tourism.

At the St. Peter farmer's market purchase honey sticks, fresh-cut flowers and farm-fresh eggs, jams, breads, pickles & veggies. Find it at the corner of Mulberry Street and Minnesota Avenue.

Pleasant Grove Pizza Farm offers a dining experience like no other! Just outside of Waseca, you can order brick-oven pizza with farm-fresh toppings. Bring your own chairs, beverages and utensils, then enjoy delicious pizza and breathtaking views of the 50-acre farm.

Hunt for morel mushrooms in southeastern Minnesota, 2019 morel sightings included Winona, Chatfield, and Lanesboro. Look in woodlands, under and around decaying elm, ash, poplar and apple trees, as well as on south-facing slopes.

Berry up this spring at Lorence's Berry Farm in Northfield, where you can pick your own strawberries. Then head over to River Bend Nature Center to take part in maple tree tapping and learn how this traditional northern sweet syrup is made.





EAT OUT (& AIR OUT)

Take advantage of spring arriving earlier in SOMN! Soak up the beautiful sunshine, great views, and fresh air along with delicious flavors from this region's top patio & rooftops dining venues.

- → Settle in at the Lake House on Pepin in Lake City. Sip on a specialty cocktail while taking in the tranquil views of the lake.
- → The Marina Lodge in Fairmont sits on Lake Sisseton, and has a fun tiki bar, live music, grill, and lawn games including hammerschlagen.
- → At the Grandview Valley Winery in Belview, guests come from near and far for the patio eating at the vineyard, made-from-scratch pizza, and picturesque Minnesota River Valley landscape.
- → Sit on the airy patio at the **Bergen** Bar & Grill in Bergen, and sink your teeth into prime rib and shrimp.

Listen, watch and appreciate the performing and fine arts in diverse venues, or dig in and get creative (and maybe a little messy) doing some crafting and art-making of your own.

Take off on the City Art Walking Sculpture Tour in Mankato, then check out the Quilt Show in New Ulm at the city's event center, which includes more than 400 quilts, vendors, and demonstrations. Don't miss the RAW **Fusion Fashion Show in Mankato** where contestants show off designs made from raw building materials.

The Odin Craft Mill is a destination for handmade, one-of-a-kind items. Crafters display their work in a 1923 feed mill for spring, fall and holiday shows. The Nobles County Art Center in Worthington features a gallery of rotating artists, workshops, art sales, and gallery talks. At Shellee's Greenhouse in Madelia, embellish a mason jar with succulents, take a kitchen garden class, and shop for plants, accessories and gifts.

The celebrated Minnesota Marine Art Museum in Winona boasts art inspired by water including pieces by Monet, Picasso, and tours tailored for all ages. Catch a concert at the Oak Center General Store on Highway 63 whose amazing 100-year-old community hall acoustics pair amazingly with organic popcorn and home-made cookies.

Explore the Northfield Arts Guild, made up of 4 locations including the Center for the Arts. Arts Guild Theater, Gift Shop, and Galleries, including classes and a concert series. Also visit the Little Theatre of Owatonna, a community theater since 1966, has produced over 200 plays, promoting cultural and artistic exploration and expression.









WILDLIFE, FISHING, & HUNTING

Follow tracks, watch for rare birds, and participate in the spring hunting traditions of SOMN. Just gear up and get out there.

Mississippi Bluff Country will be this season's trout fishing destination! Make sure to stop at the National Trout Center in Preston, which educates visitors about the environmental conservation and the fish's cultural importance, as well as the unique characteristics of the Driftless (unglaciated) Area. Next, try out SOMN's new way to fish, with the Minnesota Trout Association's 9-hole Fishing Course winding along the South Branch Root River. Brook, brown, and rainbow trout can be found and changes in river flow characteristics keep the challenge interesting for anglers. For more world-class trout fishing, visit the spring-fed streams at Forestville/Mystery Cave State Park. Stay in a camper-cabin and visit historic Forestville's 1800s village and trade center.

Make Austin your home base for pheasant hunting this season. Set out on a peaceful prairie walk in search of this upland bird,

then enjoy a bite to eat in town and share your best hunting stories over a beer with friends.

Spot wood ducks and herons along the Des Moines River in Kilen Woods State Park, then cast a line for walleye, northern, catfish and bullhead.

For spring turkey hunting, make your way to Watson Hunting Camp & Bar. Located on Lac qui Parle and the Minnesota River, experience a hunting adventure with private land access as well as great spring fishing. Go birding at Salt Lake near the town of Marietta. From atop the viewing platform, try to spot non-native species as they stop over on their way to the coast.

Practice archery at Saratoga Archery Club, a family-friendy destination with roots in the community since the 1950s. Archery ranges meander through oak forests and along the Cottonwood River.

Sleep on it!



Reel It In

Round up your friends, or go solo. SOMN has you covered for fishing gear and tackle, dozens of lakes and rivers for endless time on the water, and an amazing diversity of species to write home about.

- → In Wabasha, cast a line for walleye and largemouth bass on the Mississippi River and Robinson Lake and stop by Reads Landing Brewing Company after a long day on the water.
- → The fishing in Martin County includes 10 lakes, countless fishing holes and endless fun and relaxation. Find panfish, bass, pike, catfish and walleye. From 1,040-acre Fox Lake to 84-acre George Lake, each has its own character and unique experience to discover.
- → At Camden State Park, fish the Redwood River for brown trout and in Brawner Lake try your hand at bass and bluegill. The park includes a picnic shelter with electricity and a wood stove.
- → Set out on Big Stone Lake in search of walleyes, bluegills, crappies and largemouth bass. At the border of Minnesota and South Dakota, this 26-mile long lake is the source of the Minnesota River. Explore nearby granite and gneiss quarries and search for fossilized shark teeth.







Selfie time! FLOWERS IN BLOOM


Don't miss these refreshing springtime photo stops!


Get up close and personal with the happy yellow blooms on the Prickly Pear Cactus at Blue Mounds State Park. Find beautiful backdrops of prairie wildflowers and grasses, no filter needed. At Camden State Park, snap pictures of white trillium, bloodroot, trout lilies and violets.


At Beaver Creek Valley State Park, pose among wildflowers blanketing the forest floor while migratory songbirds sweeten the moment.

Hidden Falls along Prairie Creek at Nerstrand Big Woods State Park is calling to you! Find an array of spring blooms like hepatica, bloodroot, Dutchman's breeches, and the rare dwarf trout lily.

Catch some blooms at **Blossom Town** Floral, Garden & Gifts in Redwood Falls. Find surprises around every corner with a greenhouse, gift shop and fun features like a prom flower bar.

- → At Rochester's Mavo Park Sunday Concert Series, jam out to live tunes in this inspiring green space. The South Fork Zumbro River winds around the park's open grassy spaces and is dotted with shade trees. Bring a lawn chair, blanket, and cooler or grab a bite to eat at the concessions.
- → At the Verne Drive-in Theater you can catch a flick with your sweetheart with a broadcast through your car's FM signal. Enjoy popcorn, fountain drinks, mini donuts, smoothies and pickles. Movies start at dusk, in Luverne.
- → Enjoy Central Park Concerts in Owatonna! Dance and groove in the park with picnic grounds, fountain and a stage. Live bands play on Thursdays throughout the summer.
- → Visit the **Vetter Stone Amphitheater** on the banks of the Minnesota River with tiered limestone slab seating in a wood-land setting. Complete with beer and food tents and close to downtown Mankato.







HIDDEN TREASURES

Southern Minnesota has four unique regions, diverse in their historical and cultural backgrounds as well as their geographical features. Visit every region for a transformative experience.





- → From wild prairie grasses, historical villages, and Native American artifacts, to unique geology, blooming wildflowers, and enticing hunting opportunities, the Prairie Land region is as diverse as it is expansive. Nestled in the prairie, find our celebrated Round Lake Vineyards & Winery, where you can sit by the lake and sip on one of the vineyard's 15 wines. Tour the tasting room and learn more about each vintage from friendly and knowledgeable staff.
- At the vineyard's bistro, munch on drunken mussels, a bison pretzel burger, and lemon thyme cheesecake with perfect wine pairings. It doesn't get better than this.
- → The uncommon character of the Minnesota River Valley can be attributed to its rich and complex heritage. The area's Dakota roots, German influence, and natural features like the Minnesota River continue to influence the area's

economic and cultural development. There are a number of historical treasures to be explored in this region. We recommend spending time at the Nicollet County Historical Society which is the U.S. Dakota War treaty site. Exhibits here tell the story of the first inhabitants of Nicollet County, the Dakota people. Learn about the geology of the area and history of explorers, traders, and settlers. This is the site of the signing of the 1851 Treaty of Traverse de Sioux, where



24 million acres of Dakota land was ceded to the U.S. government. Learn about the transformation of the area due to agriculture and business development.

→ Mississippi Bluff Country draws you in with its interesting limestone bluffs and gently flowing rivers and streams. Also known as the "driftless area," this region was left untouched by glaciers and instead was shaped by glacial meltwater, giving it its distinctive geological features, including waterfalls and caves. Also known as Amish country, you can see horses and buggies traveling throughout the lands. and you'll also find traces of Polish cultural influence. One of the hidden gems in this area is the Branding Iron restaurant in Preston. Established in 1970, locals love the the frog legs, signature barbecue pork ribs, smoked ham steak, Canadian lobster, craft beer, wine, and

cocktails, homemade cheesecake, and ice cream sundaes.

→ The Southern Lakes region celebrates farming and agricultural interpretive sites, as well as interesting architecture and historical destinations. With prairie, hardwood forest, wetland, and of course, bountiful lakes, this region balances nature with creativity and cultural contribution. While you're here, don't miss the Wild Indigo Scientific and Natural Area in Austin, where you can experience rare native Southern Mesic Prairie flora and fauna and learn about how the history of the railroad in the region created an opportunity for ecological preservation. See endangered plants such as wild quinine and Indian plantain, as well as two types of wild indigo. Watch for birds and wildlife, hike, take beautiful pictures, and in the winter snowshoe and crosscountry ski.









AUTUMN ADVENTURES

Get an adrenaline rush with one of our fast-paced or competitive activities. From strategic geocaching and pheasant hunting to think-fast off-roading and paintball games, there will be no shortage of fall fun in SOMN.

Put on your farmer's hat for a day and participate in the fall harvest. Discover the best pumpkins for pie and the complex flavor profiles of SOMN apples. Try stomping grapes into wine and get lost in a corn maze.

Edgerton Corn Maze & Rock River Pumpkin Festival features inflatables, havrides, corn maze, carnival games, a petting zoo, lawnmower races, and a medallion hunt.

Chankaska Creek Ranch & Winery offers walking tours, a tasting room, wine shop, tasting deck, bonfires on the patio, spirits, wood-fired pizza and live entertainment.

Fireside Orchard & Gardens in Northfield has 27 varieties of apples, rose garden, a fish pond, gazebo, yard games, pies, and antique tractors.

At Hoch Orchard and Gardens, try 50 apple varieties, berries, wine grapes, see livestock and honeybees and taste honey, meats, fruits, jellies, applesauce and cider.



Fall Colors




Red Wing: climb atop Barn Bluff to view changing fall oak, maple and elm tree tops.

The Meander Art Crawl is a tour of 45 studios, featuring painting, letter press, sculpture, textiles and more. Find connections to local history, culture and landscape.


At the Lower Sioux Agency History Center, learn about the US-Dakota War and walk the trail along the river to discover historic US-Dakota War sites.



Breweries & Distilleries

There's a good story behind every brewery in SOMN and we'll bet you can track down the founders to hear it from them first hand. Classic and soulful flavors and new twists on old favorites (along with a contagious sense of community) characterize SOMN's breweries.

- → 10,000 Drops Craft Distillers in Faribault produces whiskey. bourbon and rum. In 2016, four friends came together with a shared dream and created a distillery complete with a cocktail lounge. Try the spiced rum this fall!
- → The taproom at Talking Waters Brewing in Montevideo opened in 2016 with a spirit of adventure. Check out the ceramic mugs and taste Farmer's Tan, Twisted Vines, and Stony Run.
- → Karst Brewery in Fountain was established 2015 and named for the limestone formations untouched by glaciers in the Driftless Area. Try Maggie's Farm Cream Ale, Top of the Trail American IPA, or Ember Waves Red Ale.
- → Take 16 Brewing Company in Luverne, named for US Highway 16, celebrates communities and their histories along old highway 16. Ask for the Luverne Lager or Spin the Bottle Pale Ale, and visit the tap room for hats and t-shirts, and more

From midwest to global, traditional to experimental, and everything in between, SOMN will take you on a flavor adventure which will have you coming back for seconds.


